Letter from our DOM

Thank you for the privilege of serving our Lord alongside the churches of Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Association. This association of churches is a reflection of the New Testament model of gospel partnerships.

What is Our Vision?

A few years ago, we envisioned the creation of a culture of trust and cooperation among churches of HOKSBA as they worked together to fulfill the Great Commission. That trust and cooperation has grown and there has been an increasing alignment of vision and values.

What is Happening Now?

In this last year we have seen health and growth in existing churches resulting in people who are far from God coming to know Christ and grow in their faith. We have seen existing churches making very significant gifts of finances and of property to see the establishment of new churches. There are churches who have reached a place of plateaued growth doing the hard work of re-dreaming and re-tooling in obedience to the Great Commission of our Lord.

I am excited about where we are as an association of churches. This does not mean that the way forward looks easy. I am excited because the things that we are doing together are a reflection of what the churches of the New Testament did together.

What does the New Testament Teach us about Association?

New Testament churches partnered by intentionally giving money and people for the expansion of the Kingdom. The church at Jerusalem was not threatened by the establishment of the church at Antioch, but rather sent Barnabas to make sure the church was established well and was doctrinally sound. The church at Antioch sent Paul and Barnabas to plant new churches, and then sent Paul and Silas back to those churches to make sure the churches were healthy.

Looking at the Past and the Future.

In 1952 this association of churches was established by 13 churches. By 1960 there were 35 churches. As with the churches of the NT, there have been times of peace and growth, and there have been difficult times. But God has used this association of churches to work together to expand His kingdom.

The days before us are a great opportunity for us to continue to work together as the body of Christ for the expansion of His Kingdom and the glory of His Name.

In this coming year I expect to see us continue to grow in creating a culture of trust and cooperation. I anticipate us gaining greater strategic clarity as we consider how we can recruit, assess, equip and invest in church planting and in church health. And I anticipate the addition of other churches to our association who share our doctrine, our vision, and our values.

Thank you for Partnering to Reach our Region.

Thank you again for the privilege of serving as your Director of Missions and for the significant investment the churches of Heart of Kansas consistently make in the health and growth of the Kingdom of our Lord in this region. Our focus on this geographic field is one of the things that local associations of churches do best.

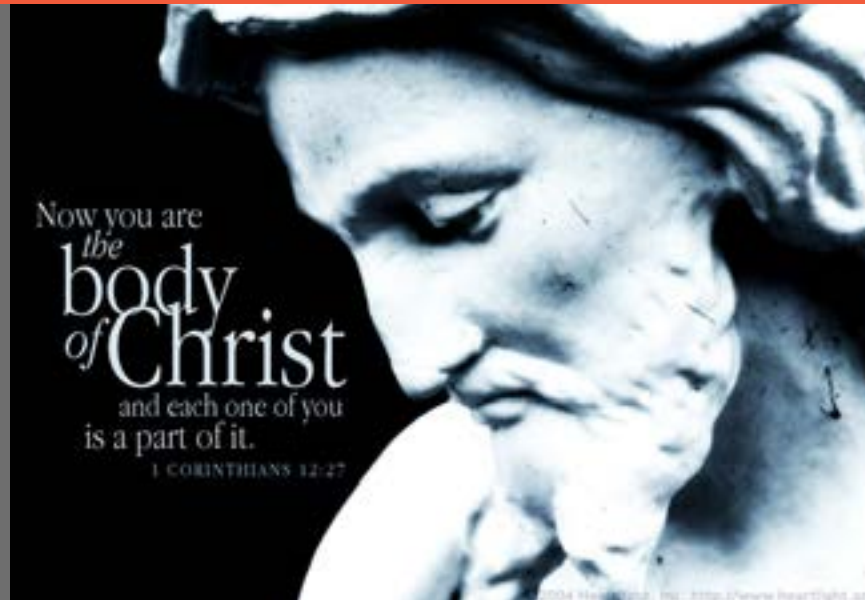

Terry Williams, pastor of River Community Church, welcomed attendees and opened with prayer.

Moderator Dennis Burns called the meeting to order.

Seating of Messengers ... Motion by Dennis Burns that the 121 messengers in the sanctuary, and those arriving after the beginning of the Meeting, constitute the body of the 63rd Annual Meeting of the Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Association. Motion carried.

DOM Report ... Glenn Davis. As of October 1, Abraham Arevalo and Brad Simmons are no longer employed by HOKSBA; they are now fully employed by NAMB, and will work for HOKSBA on part-time basis. Glenn's report is recorded in the Annual Book of Reports. The report emphasized that change is coming to our Association and in our community/world (Luke 5:37-38). The Way Forward is seeing that Kingdom Work is much larger than HOKSBA or any affiliated church. We need to return to the Great Commission, to the Call God has placed in our lives. We can give (ex: World Hunger Day) and we can pray. God calls us to continue learning ["Study to show yourself approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth." (2 Tim. 2:15)]. We all need to be passionate about doing this if we are going to reach the world with the gospel, to do what Jesus has called us to do: love God with all your heart and to love your neighbor as yourself. Pray that God will continue His work in this area; that new churches will be planted; and that existing churches will be strengthened.

Appointing Acting Parliamentarian ... Dennis Burns. Jerry Smith was not able to join us for the Annual Meeting. The Moderator nominated Ron Pracht (Olivet) to position of Acting Parliamentarian. Approved.

AMDC/Danny Dirks Report ... Cody Busby. See page 32. In addition to Report, AMDC proposed spending \$42,000 from the Danny Dirks Fund to support four church plants in 2015: Three Wooden Crosses Cowboy Church (3WC - \$12,000); CenterPoint Church (\$12,000); Logos (\$6,000); and Sojourn (\$12,000). Approved.

Financial Report ... Darrell Duncan. See insert. As of the end of September, we are \$3,242.61 under our budgeted church income amount. This amount has been countered by controlled misc. expense and interest income. We started 2014 with a balance of \$92,912.77; our new balance is \$128,773.89. We do have some line-items that are "over", specifically the cost of insurance increased significantly in 2014 vs. 2013 (new insurance provider has been procured to decrease this overage). Approved.

Shiloh Funds Recommendation ... Darrell Duncan. See page 40 of the Annual Book of Reports. Approved.

2015 Budget ... Darrell Duncan. See page 39 of the Annual Book of Reports. Approved.

Constitution changes ... Kelly Randolph. See insert. The 2013 Annual Meeting Messengers appointed a Constitution Committee with evaluating the current HOKSBA Constitution and bringing any recommended changes to this year's Meeting. Drafts were presented at the April and July Executive Board Meetings, and changes were made based on Executive Board Member feedback. Discussion regarding Proposed Changes will take place after Break.

Two specific issues have been addressed in the Final Draft:

1. Baptist Faith and Message. Article III, Section 1: Changed to "This association shall consist of cooperating Southern Baptist churches whose faith and practice is in accordance with the doctrine expressed in The 2000 Baptist Faith and Message..." in order to preserve doctrinal integrity. Committee asks all established churches and plants to agree to this language, while acknowledging local church autonomy (see Section 3).
2. Messenger Allowance. Article V, Section 1(c): Changed to "Each church shall be represented by church appointed messengers to the Annual Meeting. Each church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers from a weekly worship attendance of up to one hundred (100), and one (1) messenger for each additional one hundred (100) or fraction thereof in weekly worship attendance. No church shall have more than nine (9) messengers. All messengers must be members of the church they represent" in order to bring more equality between smaller and larger churches at Annual Meeting.

Recognition of New Staff ... Brad Simmons. Mark Penick, Metro East; Matthew Nix, Metropolitan; Philip Lawrence, Indian Southern; Kevin Ferstl, Cedar Pointe; and Steve Hazell, Country Acres Baptist Church.

Baptism Awards ... Brad Simmons. God works through His churches. The following churches recorded more baptisms in this year's ACP reports than last year: Aviator Derby; Cedar Pointe; Centerpoint Church; Country Acres; FBC Haysville; IB Getsemani; Indian Southern; Journey the Way; Olivet Baptist; Parkview; Prairie Trail Cowboy Church; Riverview; Salt City Cowboy Church; Sojourn; South City; Southwest Baptist; 3WC; West Ridge Community; Westview.

Greetings from KNCSB ... Bob Mills. Report emphasized appreciation for the generous support of the Cooperative Program (CP) and Viola Webb program. The CP funding allows Southern Baptists from KNCSB regions to reach out all across the world, starting at home. Examples included: provide funds to both existing churches and new church plants; collegiate ministries; Super Summer (where 133 came to faith this year!); and Wonderful Weekend for Women. These funds are also used to show Christ's love by

assisting the needs of others globally (ex: the Disaster Relief committee's well/water projects in the Philippines). At this time, the greatest deficit we, as The Church, have is our lack of true discipleship training. We must increase our discipleship. Church growth and church planting would be much more easily realized if we concentrated on this training. KNCSB is the only state convention that keeps 50% of its Viola Webb offerings within its borders in order to assist local churches, both established and plants. Eph. 3:16-19: "I pray that out of His glorious riches He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that

surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

Constitution changes ... Kelly Randolph. The Moderator opened the floor for discussion of the motion presented:

Tim Ohls, Believers, spoke against the motion.

John Barrett, Believers, spoke against the motion.

George Goudie, Believers, spoke against the motion.

Kelly Randolph, Committee Chair, spoke to clarify points raised by above mentioned Messengers.

Joe Boyd, Aviator Derby, spoke for the motion.

Carl Timmons, Believers, spoke against the motion.

The Moderator then moved on to the vote. The motion was presented as proposed with instructions (yes = for amendment; no = rejection of amendment in its entirety). Ballots were passed out, marked, and collected.

Committee on Committees ... Mark Jackson. See page 35 of the Annual Book of Reports. Mason Lampkin from Metropolitan added to the Credentials Committee. Approved.

Time, Place, & Preacher Report ... Dennis Burns. See page 36 of the Annual Book of Reports. Approved.

Praise & worship ... River Community Worship Team

Annual Sermon ... Dave Mitchell. Reference: Judges 3 "Whoops, I did it again!" (Christianity vs. popular culture, specifically gay marriage and Supreme Court decision). 1. God is incredibly comfortable in allowing "test" of allegiance to "remain in the land". 2. We can cry out to God earlier (pray for deliverers). 3. I doubt my ability to deliver. "CAN I DO IT?"

Results of Ballot Vote ... Dennis Burns. The marked ballots had been counted and the results were as follows: 93 in favor/37 opposed. Constitution changes were Approved. The meeting was concluded with prayer.

Midway Baptist Church
January 13, 2015

Ray Emery, pastor of Midway Baptist, welcomed attendees and opened with scripture (Hebrews 11:13-16) and prayer.

Moderator Dennis Burns called the meeting to order. Heart of Kansas received a Letter of Withdrawal from Believers' Southern Baptist, effective November 1, 2014. This action will affect various Committees. Withdrawal recognized.

Past Minutes ... Dennis Burns. Review of Minutes from October 6, 2014 Annual Meeting. Minutes approved.

AMDC ... Ray Emery. Believers' Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF) Ministry has been partly funded (\$150/month) by HOKSBA's Viola Webb account since Loren Phippen retired from HOKSBA in 2012. In light of Believers' unanimous withdrawal from HOKSBA, AMDC recommends discontinuing this monthly funding. Recommendation approved.

Financial Report ... Darrell Duncan. We ended the year in a secure financial position. Church giving was \$16,000 behind our budgeted income amount; however, spending was lower than budgeted. General Fund analysis shows that we started 2014 with a balance of \$92,000; our new balance is \$143,000. Report approved.

Hispanic Church Plant Report ... Abraham Arevalo.

- 2015 is going to be a great year for Hispanic Church work. We ask for prayers in support of these plans.
- We will be hosting our first Hispanic Church Plant Network meeting In Topeka, February 2 – 3. Persons from South Sioux City, Nebraska, Iowa, and Missouri, to name a few, will be there to learn how to be more intentional in our church planting and how to train mentors.
- We will be hosting a Disaster Relief Training in Spanish February 6 – 7. Our NAMB representative will also be in attendance.
- At the same time, Iglesia Bautista Logos (Cristian Alvarado) is growing. We are so excited at what the Lord is doing out of their weekly meetings. Robert Hazen is also starting a plant in Winfield to reach the Hispanic population there.

DOAM Report ... Glenn Davis.

- HOKSBA will be holding Disaster Relief training in English, also. Glenn will be sending out a follow-up email; if you are interested, please reply for more information.
- Glenn was able to attend the Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission's Conference, which addressed homosexuality, in October. For more information and for professional resources, visit their website at www.erc.org.
- John Hawkins will be in Wichita at the invitation of Terry Williams and River Community Church. We will have the opportunity to hear from him as well. HOKSBA will be hosting a luncheon this Thursday (January 15). We will meet at noon at River Community Church, 2130 N. Oliver. Please RSVP to our office if you would like to attend.
- For the last two or three years, KNCSB has had a task force on the Future. One of the takeaways from this group is an encouragement for KNCSB to start strategic agreements with the Associations to formalize our relational ministries. HOKSBA would like to create a task force to create our agreement, using KNCSB's as a template. We will not be changing our relationship with KNCSB; only formalizing it.

Agreement Task force ... Kelly Randolph. The Association has been asked to put together a task force to create an agreement to clarify and strengthen our relationship with KNCSB. We will present this agreement to the Executive Board at a future meeting. Please pray for the team, and encourage them in their work on our behalf. Appointed by Moderator.

Past Minutes ... Dennis Burns. Review of Minutes from January 13, 2015 Executive Board Meeting. Minutes approved.

Note: Heart of Kansas received notice that both Shalom Adonai and Audacity Church have closed. Closings recognized.

Financial Report ... Doug Morley. We ended the quarter in a secure financial position. Church giving was close to \$62,000. On the expense side we are under budget. Spending is down about \$24,000. Our cash position is strong and we are ending Quarter 1 in very good financial shape. Report approved.

Committee on Committees Report ... Bryan Jones. The Committee on Committees recommends Joe Boyd for the AMDC position left vacant by George Goudie (Believers). Recommendation approved.

Credentials Report ... Mason Lampkin. FBC Clearwater has submitted their Petitionary Letter to join Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Association. The Credentials Committee recommends that this Letter be received. Recommendation passed.

Agreement Task force ... Kelly Randolph. In our last Executive Board meeting, a special committee was formed to work on a partnership agreement between HOKSBA and KNCSB. The group consists of:

Our team met on March 23, 2015. Glenn Davis and Bob Mills were also present. As we discussed the partnership agreement, it became clear that in order to complete the shared ministry agreement with KNCSB, we needed to clarify what our associational ministry strategies would be in the near future.

With this background, we would like to recommend the following to the HOKSBA Executive Board: that the shared ministry agreement team preciously approved by the Executive Board be expanded to include Brad Simmons (HOKSBA) and Ryan McCoskey (The Seed), and that the purpose of this group also be extended to include clarifying and recommending associational ministry strategies for the near future. The team will report back to the Executive Board with recommendations at a future meeting. Recommendation approved.

Hispanic Church Plant Report ... Abraham Arevalo.

- Changes in the Association life have directly affected the Hispanic work in our area. The last few months have been very important for the network of Hispanic Church Planters – have been able to connect with different Associational and State Conventions, and held training for the development of leadership.
- Two new Church Plants have been started (or will start May 1) in the Wichita area.
- Please pray for three new Church Plants in Nebraska, with another hopefully starting in the Topeka area.

Church Plant Report ... Brad Simmons.

- We are exploring new Church Plants in the Wichita area as a way to serve “new to Wichita” cultures, including West African and Micronesian refugees.
- City Life & Journey the Way are sending Church Planters to start churches in San Diego, CA and Lee Summit, MO. Please pray for their fundraising efforts.

- Brad, along with several pastors from our Association, spent last week at Assessment processes for potential Church Planters at West E. Free.
- The Seed is considering Planting in Lakin, KS. Please pray for this process.
- Established churches are considering bringing in apprentices to be considered as Planters in 2017. Pray also for this process.

DOAM Report ... Glenn Davis.

- Thankful for the unity with which FBC Clearwater could join HOKSBA this morning.
- There will be a mission team in town from Waterloo, IA in the next few weeks. If you could use some assistance at your building, please contact Mark Jackson.
- Wanted to let the Executive Board be aware that HOKSBA loaned Victory Community of Faith \$2,100; to date, they have repaid about half.
- Metropolitan Vietnamese has purchased a new building, and is starting the process of becoming their own church (name, 501©3, etc).
- Alan and Bethany Dawson, missionaries, will be returning to the States in October. Will need \$1,600 for a vehicle. Priscilla Sapp will be helping them to make this transition; helping to raise funds. HOKSBA's Advisory Team thinks we should help with some money, somewhere between \$500 - \$1,000. Motion? Michael Scott, Calvary Baptist; 2nd – Ray Emery, Midway Baptist Church. Motion approved to grant \$1,000 from excess in a designated account.
- HOKSBA yard is in need of attention. We have a bid for between \$5,000 - \$6,000 to: find/fix well, install new sprinklers, and install new landscaping. We have funds in a designated account that have never been used. Recommendation by Ray Emery that we allot up to \$6,000 to repair landscaping and well-systems. Seconded by Dale Kelly, FBC Maize. Recommendation approved.

Moderator Dennis Burns called the meeting to order.

Past Minutes ... Dennis Burns. Review of Minutes from April 14, 2015 Executive Board Meeting. Minutes approved.

Financial Report ... Darrell Duncan. Review of new budget format. Receipts down year to date; expenses are \$21,000 below budget. Report approved. Recommendation from Budget & Finance Committee to research other investment opportunities for money previously held in CDs. Recommendation approved.

AMDC Recommendation ... Cody Busby. The AMDC recommends funding Jonathan Castillo \$500/mo for the remainder of the year as intern for Iglesia Bautista Logos. Recommendation approved.

Credentials Report ... Ron Pracht. Vietnamese Metropolitan Baptist has submitted their Petitionary Letter to join Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Association. The Credentials Committee recommends that this Letter be received. Recommendation passed.

The Credentials Committee recognizes that Southwest Baptist Church ceased to be a part of Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Church when they voted in February, 2015 to join with Word of Life Church.

Agreement Task force ... Kelly Randolph. A special committee was formed to work on a partnership agreement between HOKSBA and KNCSB. The group consists of:

We have started to clarify what our associational ministry strategies will be for the near future. Our next meeting will take place on July 21. Once these strategies have been clarified, we will discuss our partnership with KNCSB. There are no recommendations today; once there are, the team will report back to the Executive Board or Annual Messengers with recommendations at a future meeting.

Hispanic Church Plant Report ... Abraham Arevalo.

- Three new Church Plants have been started in the KNCSB area since our last meeting (Nebraska and Wichita).
- Jonathan Castillo will be interning with Cristian Alvarado (IB Logos), in order to gain experience as a church plant before moving to Topeka next year. We will also use this time to develop strategies for his new plant.
- 100 youth attended the Latino Super Summer in June. We use this time as a way to develop leadership and plant seeds for future church plants/leaders. Twenty-two kids gave their lives to the Lord; 60 others made personal commitments.
- Mission teams from Arkansas traveled to Wichita in June to assist Casa de Dios and Sojourn.
- We will be "restarting" Iglesia Bautista Getsemani, and are in need of a sponsor church to assist with this process. For more information on what this sponsorship will entail, please contact Abraham at the office.

Church Plant Report ... Brad Simmons.

- City Life & Journey the Way (JTW) have sent Church Planters to start churches in San Diego, CA and Lee Summit, MO. Please pray for their fundraising and growth efforts.
- JTW has welcomed Kyle Lammott as a Church Planting Apprentice. Kyle and his family are living in the north/northwest

part of the city, and hope to plant a church there in 2016.

- Brandon Redic has started The Bridge Church in the north Oliver area of town. Please pray for their fundraising and growth efforts.
- Other guys are on the radar to begin church planting process for 2016.

DOAM Report ... Glenn Davis.

- Crusaders Church (pastor is Ron Harris) will be closing in mid-August. Our conversation now centers around how the Lord will use this time of transition.
- Jim McQuery, Jr. (pastor at Randall Road in Park City) suffered a massive heart attack over a week ago. His family is making a decision regarding continued life support today. Please pray for his wife, Angela, and the rest of the McQuery family.
- Emails have been sent out regarding the Affordable Health Care Act and the recent SCOTUS ruling. Please contact Glenn at the office if you have any questions.
- Simeon Trust (preaching) Workshop will return to Wichita October 7-9. HOKSBA will reimburse \$50 to those who attend. Please let the office know if you wish to be reimbursed.

Principe de Paz is a new church in Wichita. Church planter Baldemar Ziad started this church, which is sponsored by Parkview Baptist Church. They have held regular services at Parkview since May.

Iglesia Bautista Logos, a church plant sponsor by Tyler Road Baptist Church, is now meeting in a new location. Olivet Baptist Church has opened their doors for Logos, and they are now having services at Olivet on Sunday mornings under a new name "Encuentro con Cristo". Two new families had joined the church since the change of location. Please pray for Cristian and Nelly Alvarado as they lead this church.

Jonathan Castillo is now serving as a church planter apprentice at Encuentro con Cristo. In January 2016, Jonathan and his wife Betsy will move to Topeka to start a new Hispanic church sponsored by First Baptist Church in Topeka.

Roberto and Vicky Hazen, a church planting missionaries supported by Country Acres Baptist Church, are reaching to the Hispanics in the Winfield and Arkansas City Area. Worship services in Spanish are being held at Arkansas City on Saturdays and Sundays at Winfield. Bible studies, kids', and youth activities are happening through out the week in both locations.

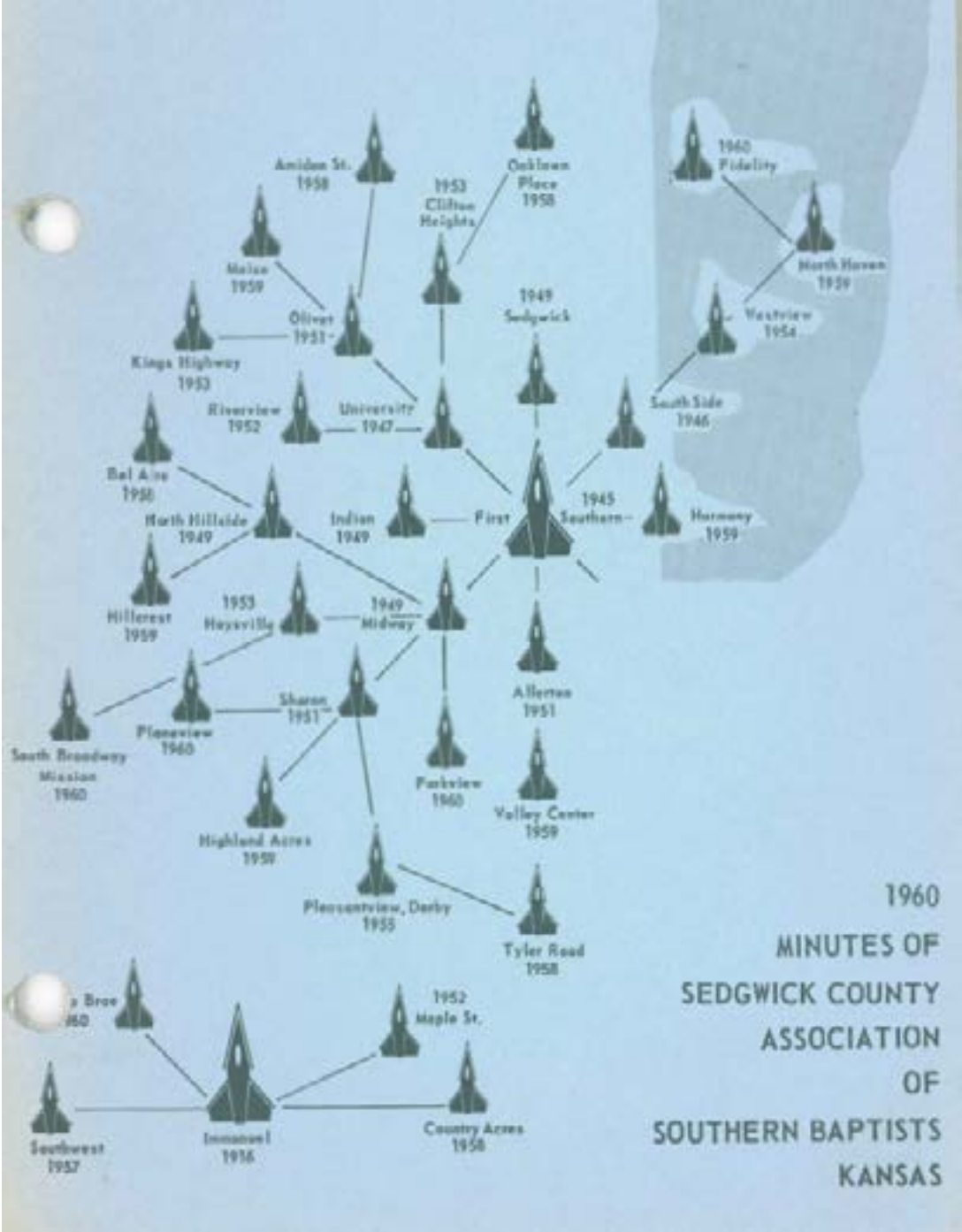

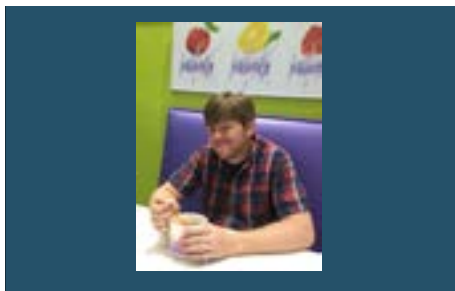

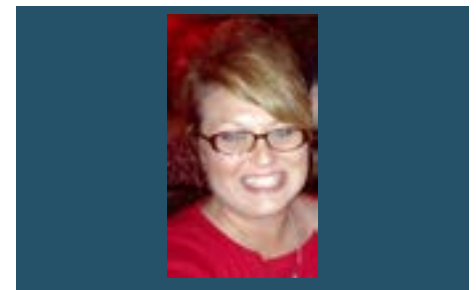

CONSTITUTION/BY LAWS

ARTICLE I: NAME

This body shall be known as the Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II: MISSION

The Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Association exists to lead and assist participating churches to fulfill the Great Commission as they cooperate in the creation and development of healthy churches.

While recognizing the autonomy of each church to follow the dictates of God through the Scriptures, The Heart of Kansas Southern Baptist Association shall endeavor to carry out its mission in cooperation with the Kansas Nebraska Convention of Southern Baptists and the Southern Baptist Convention's global missions enterprise.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: This association shall consist of cooperating Southern Baptist churches whose faith and practice is in accordance with the doctrine expressed in The 2000 Baptist Faith and Message, and who have been granted affiliation with the Association through due process, and who share in the mission of the Association.

Section 2: Any church wishing to join the association shall file a petitionary letter with the Credentials Committee. Upon recommendation of the Credentials Committee a petitioning church may be received into membership upon the majority vote of either the Annual Meeting of the Association, or the quarterly meeting of the Executive Board.

Section 3: While this Association does not have authority over a local church, it reserves the right to withdraw membership from any church found corrupt in faith and/or practice. This Association shall seat no messengers from churches that receive members without requiring a public profession of repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, followed by believer's baptism, exercised by the proper authority of a New Testament church.

Section 4: A church found corrupt in faith and/or practice shall be removed from membership upon recommendation from the Credentials Committee and two-thirds vote of the Annual Meeting. Any church desiring to terminate its membership with this Association will notify the Association. Recognition of this action will be taken upon the recommendation of the Moderator of the Association at an Executive Board or Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Vice-Moderator, and Parliamentarian, who shall hold the same position on the Executive Board of the Association. The officers of the Association shall be members of member churches. The Moderator may serve no more than two consecutive terms. Officers shall serve one year terms beginning at the conclusion of the Annual Meeting.

Section 2: The Committee on Committees shall nominate the Officers Nominating Committee consisting of a chairperson and two members to serve for one year. Members cannot serve two consecutive years. This committee will present a recommended slate of officers to the Annual Meeting to serve the Association for the coming year. Additional nominations may be made from the floor.

Section 3: The Executive Board shall neither remove nor replace a Moderator, Vice Moderator, or Parliamentarian. In case of the permanent absence of the Moderator, the Vice Moderator will take the office and the Parliamentarian will become Vice Moderator. In case of the permanent absence of both Moderator and Vice Moderator, the Parliamentarian will succeed to the office of Moderator. Shall the permanent absence of all three Associational officers occur, the Executive Board shall appoint one of its members to preside as acting chairman of its meetings. Should an emergency arise, the acting chairman shall have the authority to call a special meeting of the Executive Board.

Section 4: If, during the absence of all the Associational Officers, a signature on some official and/or legal paper should be required, the Executive Board shall authorize one of its members to sign such paper.

ARTICLE V: MEETINGS

Section 1: Annual Meeting

- (a) The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as selected by the body.
- (b) A Special Called Meeting of the Association may be called at the discretion of the Executive Board. Representation at such meetings shall be determined by Article V, Section 1 (c) and (d). Proper notification of such meetings will be made in writing to member churches and appointed Executive Board members at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting.
- (c) Each church shall be represented by church appointed messengers to the Annual Meeting. Each church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers from a weekly worship attendance of up to one hundred (100), and one (1) messenger for each additional one hundred (100) or fraction thereof in weekly worship attendance. No church shall have more than nine (9) messengers. All messengers must be members of the church they represent.
- (d) A multi-site church may combine the worship service attendance for all of its sites for the purpose of calculating its messengers. A sponsoring church may include the worship service attendance of its church plants in calculating its messengers, until those church plants become independent.
- (e) Weekly worship attendance shall be determined by the current year's Annual Church Profile (ACP). In the event a church has not submitted the current year's ACP, the messenger allotment will be based on the previous year's ACP. If neither ACP is on file, the church will be entitled to four (4) messengers.
- (f) The Credentials Committee will have authority in determining allotted messengers based on these criteria.
- (g) The Association staff, in coordination with the officers, shall prepare a proposed agenda for the Annual Meeting to be sent to member churches at least 15 days before the Annual Meeting.

Section 2: Executive Board

- (a) The Executive Board shall consist of the officers of the Association, the pastor of each church cooperating in the Association, and two others appointed by each church annually. Each church will be entitled to three (3) board members. Each church is entitled to furnish its own alternates in the absence of any of its board members. Executive Board members and alternates must be members of the church they represent.
- (b) Any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- (c) The Executive Board shall transact any and all business of the Association during the interim, provided that nothing shall be done by the Board contrary to the Constitution or the expressed will and purpose of the Association.
- (b) Scheduled meetings for the Executive Board shall be published at the Annual Meeting.
- (c) The Moderator may call a special Executive Board meeting at his own discretion. In the absence of the Moderator, the Vice Moderator shall have this authority. Proper notification of special Executive Board meetings will be made in writing to member churches and appointed Executive Board members at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting.

ARTICLE VI: EXECUTIVE SECRETARY-TREASURER

Section 1: This Association shall have the authority to employ an Executive Secretary-Treasurer (DOAM) who shall supervise all other employees of the Association. The Executive Secretary-Treasurer may be approved at a regular or special called Executive Board meeting where a two-thirds majority vote will be required.

Section 2: The DOAM may be dismissed by a two-thirds majority vote of a special called meeting of the Executive Board.

Section 3: If it is determined by the Advisory Committee that the DOAM has acted in an immoral or criminal manner, he shall be placed on paid administrative leave pending action by the Executive Board in a special called meeting.

ARTICLE VII: BUSINESS

Section 1: Proposed amendments to the Constitution must be presented in writing to the Associational Staff at least forty-five days prior to the Annual Meeting, and must be included in the proposed agenda per Article V: Section 1 (g). The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the messengers present at an Annual Meeting.

Section 2: This Association shall follow the Parliamentary Procedures as set forth in Roberts Rules of Order, Revised.

ASSOCIATIONAL POLICIES

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. All committees of this association shall be composed of five (5) members except where specifically stated. The chairman of each committee may serve only two (2) consecutive terms.
2. The moderator and the DOAM shall be an ex-officio members of all associational committees. An ex-officio member may vote only to break a tie.

1. Associational Missions Development Council:

AMDC is to work with the Director of Missions and staff of HOK to promote the over-all Missions program of the association. This committee will bring recommendations concerning the establishment and support of new church plants. This will be done through funding as well as ongoing training and accountability standards for those receiving support. This committee shall be composed of not more than eight (8).

2. Budget and Finance Committee:

This committee, working with the Director of Associational Missions and staff shall develop a proposed budget to be presented for adoption at the annual meeting of the association. This committee shall receive monthly budget reports from the associational office and give oversight to budgetary and financial matters. This committee shall carry out the provisions of the budget and propose any adjustments which may be necessary.

This committee will also give oversight to the properties owned by the association. The members will ensure that adequate insurance is maintained to protect the association, consider its uses and any structural changes made to property owned by the association.

This committee will provide recommendations for the buying and selling of property owned by the association. Any such recommendations for buying and selling property will require action by the Executive Board OR the Association in its annual meeting.

3. Camp Committee:

This committee is responsible for planning and promoting camp programs, such as Kids Camp and Day Camp. It is also responsible for enlisting the directors.

4. Committee on Committees:

This committee is to work with the Director of Associational Missions in the recommending of names of those to serve on the various committees of the association. It will function throughout the year to fill any committee vacancies. This committee shall be composed of three (3) members.

5. Credentials Committee:

This committee reviews and makes recommendations concerning petitionary letters for recognition of new churches to be affiliated with our association and other related duties as may be assigned to them by the association or Executive Board.

6. Director of Missions Search Committee: (Ad Hoc)

When seeking an Executive Secretary-Treasurer/Director of Missions for the Association, the Officers of the Association shall recommend a Search Committee of five (5) persons, with two (2) additional persons being nominated from the floor, to the Executive Board for approval. It will be the task of the Search Committee to bring their nominee for approval to a regular or called Executive Board Meeting where two-thirds (2/3) majority vote will be required for the Executive-Director-Treasurer to be elected.

7. Evangelism Committee:

This committee is to promote the total yearly program of evangelism, which may include annual evangelism rally, promote and provide training in personal evangelism, and church-wide evangelism, joint evangelism efforts, simultaneous revivals or other evangelistic activities.

8. Officer Nominating Committee

The Committee on Committees shall nominate the Officers Nominating Committee consisting of a chairperson and two members to serve for one year. Members cannot serve two consecutive years. This committee will present a recommended slate of officers to the Annual Meeting to serve the Association for the coming year. Additional nominations may be made from the floor.

9. Policy Committee:

This committee shall be responsible to study the work of the committees, councils, and programs of the association, determine proper correlation and define their responsibilities. Any questions concerning policy shall be referred to this committee. The Policy Committee will bring any recommended changes to the Executive Board for approval.

10. Task Force Appointment:

A task force (short-term committee) shall be appointed by the moderator in consultation with the officers of the association as need arises. Should the Executive Board determine that the work of a task force needs to be ongoing, it will be changed to a standing committee.

11. Time, Place, and Preacher Committee:

The purpose of this committee is to appoint a time, place and preacher for the annual meeting. This committee shall be appointed by the Moderator and shall bring its recommendation to the annual meeting for the year.

12. Disaster Relief Committee:

The Disaster Relief Team shall work with the churches and volunteers to provide training, communicate opportunities, and oversee the equipment for the work of SBC Disaster Relief in HOKSBA.

13. DOAM Advisory Committee:

This team will be made up of the Moderator, Vice Moderator, Parliamentarian, and two (2) at-large members selected by the DOAM. Its role will be to provide accountability and advice to the DOAM.
